I was using an ICom 706MK2G with a Comet Mag Mount antenna for 2 meters.

lAlso who was from Arizona and driving thru Tehachapi on his way to Sac., KB6RHD from SLO K6AJ (No Relations) and N6DXN who was driving thru Lancaster.

After 2 hours and no further response I switched over to HF and 20 meters was hopping. I was using a Hustler Mag Mount for 20 meters. For the next hour and a half I made 51 QSO's on 20 meters. One contact was made on satellite AO-91



50 Years Old

There is considerable concern for potential disaster as a result of the Y2K effect on our High-Tech lifestyle. Even the date 9-9-99 received considerable attention. When May 12, 1999 came, it was allowed to pass as just another day, with no recognition that it marked the 50 Th. birthday of our Amateur Radio Club.

On May 12, 1949, this Club was declared official in the office of the Secretary of State of California. Our Club is now on it's third name. Initially it was the Kern County Radio Club. On April 7, 1981, the word "Amateur" was officially incorporated into the Club name because of confusion with a popular local CB organization.

In 1987 the Central Valley Amateur Radio Club, that normally met in Delano, merged with the Kern County Amateur Radio Club. A certificate of amendment of the Articles of Corporation of our Club, was filed in the office of the Secretary of State, and on May 21, 1987, we officially became the Kern County-Central Valley Amateur Radio Club, Inc.

I have been a member of this Club for approximately 40 of those 50 years. I have known our Club to have enjoyed good times, and times that were not so good. As we move into the year 2000, about half of our Club's Board of Directors will not have served before. There are issues facing our Club, that are of paramount importance, and should be addressed early in the year.

The past is prologue, but as it relates to the future of our Club, a progressive success will depend on the unification of the Board, and the support of Club members. Any association is effective only to the extent to which it's goals, and purpose, are realistic in terms of it's needs, and to which those who are interested, support it and participate actively.
