

Rig pick of the month



The new Alinco DJ-X100 wideband receiver, 5 digital modes

On August 20, 2022, Alinco Co., Ltd. released the handheld wideband receiver that supports WFM/FM/AM in analog mode and five digital modes:

C4FM/DSTAR/DCR/NXDN/DMR., Announced at the company's booth (B-17) at Ham Fair 2022. The reception frequency range is 30 to 470MHz (some frequencies are excluded), the external dimensions are 58W x 110H x 32.5mm (about 1.28 in), and the weight including the antenna and battery pack is about 260g (about 9.17 oz). The price is undecided, and it was scheduled to be released in early spring 2023.

Shafter woman heads amateur radio operators

Eighteen Amateur Radio Operators met September 26th in Delano to reorganize what was formerly the Delano Amateur Radio Club. In the business session the members voted to change the name to Central Valley Radio Club, elected a slate of officers and discussed future operations of the organization.

Elected to serve as the club's first president was Mrs. Joyce Largent (WB6VGZ) of Shafter, widely knownforher Amateur Radio activities in assisting service personnel stationed overseas with radio-telephone contacts with their families in the United States.

During the Viet Nam war. Mrs. Largent and her husband Don Largent (WA6QFJ) handled over 100,000 of these contacts and have been awarded citations by several military organizations for their activites. Mr. Largent is the owneroperator of the 2-meter repeater station located on a peak near McKitthat serves the trick Amateur Radio fraternity over a large area of the valley and the coast.

Others elected to of-

fice in the club were Larry Bell (W6UBA) of Delano as vice president and Leon Brammer (W-6BYH) of Delano as Secretary-Treasure. Both Bell and Brammer are associated with the Voice of America Transmitter Station at Delano.

The eighteen operators who attended the meeting from as far away as Bakersfield and Taft and signed to become members, will be signers to the club's charter as will those who attend the mext meeting and become members. The membership will be divided into three sec-The full memtions. bership will be offered to any licensed Amateur Operator. An Associate membership for those not licensed but who have an interest in Amateur Radio and who would like to become licensed Amateurs and. the Junior Member for those under 16 years of age who are interested in Amateur Radio.
